On top of this passion, she's had "meaningful conversations with a variety of different stakeholders," making her a worthy recipient of the Martha 'Marty' Wilder PFAC scholarship.

Advice for future PFAC scholarship applicants

"Always be curious," Michelina says! "Seek out experiences that compliment but also challenge your knowledge and skill set to make yourself as well-rounded as possible." In an industry like pet nutrition, the "industry is so nuanced and requires you to understand how your area fits into the bigger picture."

"You're likely incredibly knowledgeable about your research area ... but what drives this industry is not only **how pets interact with these products**, but also **how the pet owner experiences them** too." Michelina credits her breadth of experiences across the spectrum — from sales to research — for making her such a strong candidate for this scholarship. "I think it also highlights the **incredible program and opportunities** that I've been so fortunate to have at the University of Guelph," she adds.
